Naturalist's Notes:

There is nothing like the first real snowfall of winter, when the world turns white, quiet and still, and the jewel-covered trees glisten in the morning sun. A blue jay stands out starkly and starts a tree-born avalanche just by landing on a branch.

The light of the mid-day sun and the white covering on the ground and trees make the brightness almost blinding. Powdery snow collapses underfoot as you walk through the forest. The sight of the

trackless trails gives you the knowledge that you are the first - the first to step foot in this winter wonderland. The sound of a tree limb full of fresh snow slipping off its perch and falling to the forest floor is like the crashing of two pillows - the impact barely makes a report. Look closely at a gloved handful of this sparkling gift from the skies. Individual ice crystals can be seen interlocked with each other: each one unique, slightly different in its own way, the tiny ice crystals arranged in a radially symmetrical hexagon. Breathe in the fresh, cold air as you walk through the forest, and witness an ephemeral masterpiece of nothing more than frozen water, yet like nothing else on Earth.

Whether you'll see your first or 500th snowfall, come out and join us on our trails this January and experience your own winter magic!

RESTORATION OF OUR TRAILS Volunteers Needed!

The Closter Nature Center will soon begin the long-planned restoration of the CNC's boardwalk. We would love to hear from individuals who'd be interested in participating in the somewhat physically demanding work involved. There will be planning, measuring, cutting, and transporting of black locust planks throughout the preserve's trails to replace ones that have been damaged.

The boardwalk was initially installed approximately 20 years ago and sections are decaying and need to be removed. We expect the new planks to arrive in mid- December. Installation will be weather-dependent.
