Naturalist's Notes:

As a diehard fisherman and forager, my year is not broken up by months, dates or even holidays, but the seasons for certain fish and other culinary delights that nature offers. November means a lot to me, as it is the tail end of mushroom season and the beginning of clam season.

Clamming begins in New Jersey on November first and runs through to the end of April. At least twice a month during winter clam season I make a trek to the shore to collect clams. While there are many types of clams in the northeast, there are two that I am after: hard-shell clams and soft-shelled clams. Hard clams are often referred to by a variety of names based on the clam's size. Top neck clams are small and often eaten raw on the half shell; the largest ones are called chowders and are used in soups, and as the main ingredient in stuffed clams. The real prize to be found on the clam grounds are soft shelled clams, which are often called Ipswich clams or steamers. Steamed until they open and dipped in melted butter...there is not much that's better!

The eating part is great, but what makes them even better is how they are collected. It starts by donning a pair of waders and walking out through the water onto the sandy mud flats of the Navesink river. Once a promising area is found the fun begins: a long-handled rake with an attached steel basket is dragged through sand, and once a hard shelled clam is hit by the rake's tines you feel it through the handle. Then you scoop with your rake until the clam is in the basket. The collecting of my favorite, soft shell clams is a little more down and dirty...literally.

For these tasty nuggets you get down on your hands and knees in the mud and dig. Once you get about a foot down, you slowly enlarge your hole by feeling along the edge of the hole with gloved hands. When you feel a clam, you carefully extract it from the sand and put it your bucket. Howling wind, freezing rain and a chilly incoming tide force you to dig fast and really appreciate the fruits of your labors.

What more could you want: exercise, beautiful scenery and dinner?! See ya on the flats! Marc Gussen, Naturalist
