Introduction to Birding: April 7th, 9 am - 11am

Spring Break 2024

Daily classes for ages 4- 10.

Need something fun and educational for the kids to do during the Spring Break? We'll have four days of nature exploration and discovery here at the Closter Nature Center! Dress for outdoor weather! **Naturalist Marc Gussen will focus on our vernal pools;** Spring is a very active and amazing time for frog and insect reproduction and birthing activity.

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Naturalist's Notes:

The CNC is about to embark on its' most ambitious tree planting endeavor yet. Over the next months we plan to get hundreds of trees planted in our precious forest. Why plant trees in forest? Over the last several years we have been facing a perfect storm of negative impacts on our forest. The combination of the loss of our Beech and Ash trees due to insects and disease, the increasing population of the white-tailed deer and the spread of invasive plant species has left our forest unable to perform the basic task of regeneration. Under normal circumstances the planting of trees in the forest would be unnecessary, but these pressures have made it mandatory for us, in light of our role as stewards of the forest, to step in, roll up our sleeves and get to work.

The task at hand is more than just planting trees. It's providing the new plantings of both trees and understory plants with needed protection to prevent them from becoming breakfast for the ever-expanding deer herd. In addition to bringing in a diverse combination of plants to replace what has been lost, we are also hard at work removing invasive plants that shade out our native flora and provide very little benefit to wildlife. As we moved forward with this project we found it imperative to improve the trails and

walking paths around the deer protection enclosures to insure that they could be maintained.

May 10th and 11th are our two big days for actually getting trees in the ground. We have been working hard preparing for this project and are looking forward to getting more of our community involved, both with volunteer work to get this done and the financial help to make it possible.
