#### **Naturalist's Notes:**

It's time to celebrate! Ruckman Pond is the shining star of the Nature Center's many wonders, and once again it is time for our annual **Pond Celebration**. Come join us for an afternoon of fun and educational activities highlighting ponds, and pond life.

Canoe rides, tie dying Closter Nature Center tee shirts, face painting, arts and crafts, and a variety of educational displays will both entertain and educate.

Over the years Ruckman Pond has been through some ups and downs.

The pond was once choked with non-native plants due to fertilizer runoff, and after some severe management practices such as hydro-raking to remove excess vegetation and some of the nutrient rich sediment, we eventually decided to dredge the pond. This removed what was left of the non-native plants, all of the nutrient rich sediment, and in the process made the pond over 2 feet deeper.

Dredging greatly improved the pond as a habitat, and did wonders for the aesthetics as well. As the amount of aquatic vegetation slowly increased, we introduced plant-eating grass carp to naturally control the problem. They were a great success and may be called on in the near future to work their magic.

A couple new pond projects are on the horizon, including stabilizing the pond bank near Ruckman Road where pond water has been leaking into the stream, and making a new erosion-proof trail around the pond.

Feel free to join the activities on June 7<sup>th</sup>, and visit the pond soon! It is looking as wonderful as ever!
